Enclosed is a copy of the 2023 Nebraska Press Association Foundation scholarship application form. For 2023, the NPA Foundation will offer up to six (6) total (high school and collegiate) scholarships of \$2,000 each.

#### Changes made to NPA Foundation scholarship application for 2023:

- Eligible to apply are 2023 Nebraska high school graduates seeking to enroll at a Nebraska-based <u>OR</u> out-of-state college/university. (Prior to 2023, only NE high school graduates that planned to attend a Nebraska-based college/university were eligible to apply.)
- Scholarships will be given to students with a specific interest in community-based journalism <u>OR</u> agricultural communications. (*Prior to 2023, only NE high school graduates with a specific interest in journalism were eligible.*)
- Scholarship applicants can now choose <u>ONE</u> (1) of four (4) different essay topics to write about (pg. 2 on application form). (*Prior to 2023, applicants' essay topic was: "Why should I receive this scholarship?"*)

Guidelines of the Nebraska Press Association Scholarship Program Sponsored by the Nebraska Press Association Foundation & Member Newspapers of the Nebraska Press Association

## This application is for JOURNALISM or AG COMMUNICATION students

1. It is proposed to award \$2,000 scholarships for the 2023 school year to qualified graduates of Nebraska high schools enrolled or planning to enroll in post-secondary educational programs at a college and university with an interest in community-based journalism or ag communications.

2. Eligible to apply are 2023 Nebraska high school graduates who are now seeking to enroll in colleges and universities. Enrollment must be on a full-time basis. The recipient must use the scholarship and enroll no later than the start of the third semester after the awarding of the scholarship.

3. The scholarships will be given to students with a specific interest in news, editorial, photography, circulation, production/design or marketing careers at a weekly, semi-weekly, or daily newspaper. The educational institution involved must offer a curriculum which provides the necessary education so a student graduating from the program is qualified for at least an entry level position in community-based journalism or ag communications.

4. Selection of the recipients will be based on scholastic ability and good citizenship in school and community. The decision of the NPA Foundation Scholarship Committee is final and not subject to review.

5. A letter of reference from the applicant's community newspaper publisher or editor may accompany the application, but this is not a requirement in order to be considered. A statement from a high-school administrator, guidance counselor, or college counselor is <u>required</u> and a letter of reference from an unrelated party (employer, clergy, coach, etc.) is also <u>required</u>.

6. 2023 scholarship funds will be paid in January 2024 (once recipient's required payout documents have been received by Nebr. Press Assn.) Funds will go directly to the college or university for deposit into the student's account) upon satisfactory completion of the first semester and proof of second semester enrollment. Unused scholarships must come to Foundation Board for decision to renew and to see if rules have been met.

7. The application form must be filled out by the applicant and an essay must be provided (pg. 2 of application). Scholarship recipients will be notified in early April.

A letter of recommendation on behalf of the student, written by a high-school administrator/ guidance counselor/college counselor, as well as a letter of recommendation written by an unrelated party (employer, clergy, coach, etc.) should be attached to this form.
